New! The City Green Harvest Festival will be held on October 24th from 11AM - 2PM, at the Learning Garden at Eastside Park.

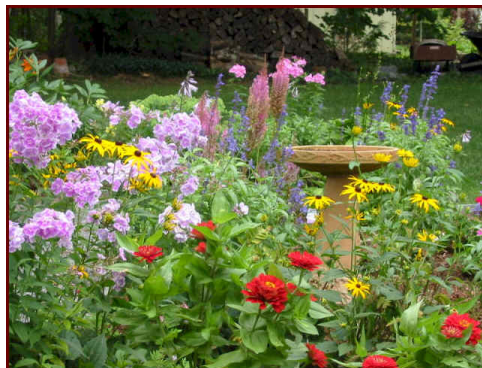
