# SPRING AT CITY GREEN FIELD TRIP MENU



City Green Field Trips take place at our learning gardens in either Clifton or Paterson. As students rotate through activity stations, they will get to harvest seasonal produce, observe farm animals and native wildlife such as insects, animals, and plants, practice sustainable gardening, and have a lot of fun outdoors! Trips are 1.5 -2 hours long.

You can select one of the three field trip options listed below!

#### **GROWING PLANTS - FROM SEED TO HARVEST**

Come and explore the science of plant growth from seed to harvest! Your students will observe the parts of the seed and how they grow through dissection and spring gardening activities. They will also make a "grass friend" to take home and watch grow!

Let's learn the different roles insects play in the gardens as pests, pollinators, and decomposers! Your students will be insect detectives in the garden by examining leaves for signs of damage, digging in the compost bin for decomposers, and watching flowers as they are pollinated.

#### **USING OUR SENSES IN THE GARDEN**

Let your senses guide the way as we discover the garden by touch, taste, smell, sound, and sight! Your students will inhale the calming power of herbs, experience mindful taste test, and see the world through the eyes of a plant!

#### Facilities & Accessibilty

#### CITY GREEN FACILITIES

- City Green trips are fully outdoors at both Paterson and Clifton locations.
- Porta-potties and hand sanitizer are available at both sites. Full public restrooms are NOT available for general use.
- Trips are encouraged to use shaded picnic spaces for lunch. Outdoor picnic seating is limited (18 max). Lunch refrigeration is available at Clifton Location.
- Students and chaperones should bring their own <u>filled</u> water bottles. Potable water is very limited at both locations.
- Parking is available for buses and cars. City Green does not provide transportation.

#### **ACCESSIBILITY**

- City Green will make reasonable accommodations to make our Field Trip program accessible.
- The Learning Farm in Clifton contains a paved educational area with wheelchair and stroller accessible paths. Upper and lower food production fields are only accessible by grass or gravel paths. Wheelchair accessible porta-potties are available.
- The Learning Garden in Paterson contains no wheelchair accessible areas, and has hills without paved paths.

#### Payment and Cancellation

#### **PAYMENT POLICY:**

- Field trip costs are \$11 per student. Financial support eligibility is determined by the school's percentage of students eligible for free/reduced lunch, and will be included in the price quote. Chaperones are welcomed on City Green field trips at no cost.
- Payment by cash/check should be made on the day of the trip. Payment by credit card can be requested in advance by email.

#### **INCLEMENT WEATHER**

- City Green Field Trips are outdoors and weather dependent.
  - o Trips will be canceled if there are heavy rains, snow, or temperatures above 95°F.
  - Weather-based cancellations will be made at 7:00 AM on the morning of the trip.
  - Trips will be rescheduled depending upon City Green and school availability.

#### Safety Protocols

#### COMING PREPARED AND ON SITE SAFATY

- All visitors must wear the proper apparel for the outdoors. This can include closed-toe shoes, hats, sunscreen, rain jackets, and/or warm layers, depending on the weather.
- All visitors should bring filled water bottles to stay safely hydrated. Potable water is not always available.
- All visitors must follow City Green's instructions on proper tool use, food safety, and animal handling. Anybody intentionally and/or repeatedly violating these instructions will not be able to participate in the activities.
- Students must stay in their assigned groups and locations throughout the trip.

#### BEE ALLERGY SAFETY (see Bee Allergy Policy & Protocol)

- All visitors must review and sign City Green's Bee Allergy Policy & Protocol prior to the trip (see last page).
- City Green must be alerted in writing a week before the field trip of any bee allergies of staff or students.
- On the day of the trip, City Green Bee Allergy Protocols must be submitted for all visitors. These individuals must be identified to the School Grounds Manager immediately upon arrival.

#### **COVID SAFETY:**

- Prospective visitors must stay home if they have any COVID symptoms or have been exposed to the virus.
- Hand sanitizer is available at all times. Hand washing when possible.
